ESTABLISHING ROUTINES - PART 2

R.O.C.K. in Your Daily Routines

- 1) "R"epeat What You Say and Do
 - Repeat what you say and do when you start a routine
 - Repeat what you say and do during the routine
 - Repeat what you say and do when you end the routine
 - Repeat the routine often with different people and in different places
- 2) "O"ffer Opportunities for Your Child to Take a Turn
 - Plan when you will offer your child a turn
 - Plan what turns your child can take
 - Offer new opportunities for turns as your child progresses
- 3) "C"ue Your Child to Take His/Her Turn
 - Use visual helpers
 - Engineer the situations
- 4) "K"eep it Fun! Keep it Going!

Sing Less and Stress, Go Slow and Show! Repeat Often!!

- 1) Sing Less
 - Sing often but choose songs that are short, containing no more than 10 key words. Children at lower levels of communication may needs songs of only 3 words.
 - Use familiar vocabulary, names of family members, carrier phrases
- 2) Stress
 - Make key words stand out by singing them louder, stretching them out and singing them last
- 3) Go Slow
 - If songs are sung too fast, the words are hard to understand
- 4) Show
 - Exaggerate actions to make it easy for your child to notice and copy what you do (e.g. clap, jump, etc.)
 - Use real objects to help with understanding (e.g. "Old MacDonald Had a Farm" using cow, pig, etc.)
 - If objects distract your child's attention, put them away and do not use them
- ** Some Popular Songs and Chants You Can Sing with Your Child:
 - -Head and Shoulders -If You're Happy and You Know It -The Wheels on the Bus -This is the Way We Wash Our Face
 - -The Itsy Bitsy Spider -Hokey Pokey
 -Ring-Around-the-Rosy -Humpty Dumpty
 -Row, Row, Row Your Boat -The "Bye-bye" Song
 - -Jack in the Box -Old MacDonald Had a Farm
- ** Make Up Songs Especially for Your Child During Daily Routines:
 - -The "Asking for More" Song -The "Drink, Drink, Drink" Song
 - -Songs to help answer yes/no
 -Songs to help learn simple directions
 -Songs to learn prepositions
 -Songs to describe what the child is doing
