# 2. State and National Activities

- a. Part C Update
  - i. So nice to hear positive experiences with EI from ITC members
  - ii. Focused on getting TRAC-IT (new data system) up and running that will meet new federal reporting requirements. System will replace ITOTs and have case management functions, electronic medical record functions, etc.
  - iii. Stakeholder group has begun on the new State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) project for quality improvement.
    Focus will be on improving outcomes for social-emotional development by the time children exit EI. Tracy Walters joined Part C staff as new IMH Coordinator and will be a resource for this work.
  - iv. We don't have our federal grant award yet. We will let localities know their allocations when we have the award.

## 3. Member Ideas and Input

- a. Dimensions Short Course for Service Providers best time to launch?
  - i. Sept/Oct and January are good times when providers may have a lull in numbers of families served
  - ii. Mid to late afternoon or evening seems to be the best time of day
  - iii. Not sure yet about the group size limit but we anticipate holding the course with 25-30 participants
    - If we have room, students who are in field placements with El programs could join too

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- b. SSIP priority for social-emotional development what resources/topics would be helpful?
  - i. How to teach about emotions using pictures
  - ii. Media and feeding how to manage when child can only eat while watching the ipad
  - iii. Autism and sleep (Book: Sleep Better by Mark Durand)
  - iv. Self-help for practitioners (Patty)
  - v. Self-help for parents
  - vi. How to have difficult conversations with families build confidence, language, tools (JoShirlon, Jessica)
  - vii. Autism and girls and what it looks like
  - viii. ToT idea hosting round-table discussions as the format rather than lecturing on topic
  - ix. TTAC created toolboxes on topics that have been well-received
    - 1. Includes short webinar (15-20 min), handouts, resources, podcasts
  - x. The PD team will be launching a social emotional learning path soon that covers different topics.
  - xi. Sensory processing and its impact on social-emotional learning (Amber has a webinar she presents)
    - Resource: "Understanding Your Child's Sensory Signals" & "Understanding Your Baby's Sensory Signals" - Angie Voss
  - xii. With the SE resources you could take the same information from the LP and create small group discussions based on those resources, if possible.
  - xiii. Resources for learning about typical and atypical s-e development (what is typical, red flags, what does it look like, theories)
    - 1. Students may be able to help with pulling these resources together. (Virginia)

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xiv. Handouts and infographics are helpful for practitioners.
