






Drug charges net 30-year prison term

Oct 19, 2012 (Wytheville Enterprise - McClatchy-Tribune Information Services via COMTEX) -- A Wytheville man will serve 30 years of a 95-year sentence stemming from drug convictions.

Milton E. Fuqua, 41, was sentenced Wednesday in Wythe County Circuit Court.

Fuqua pleaded guilty on Aug. 1 to four felonies relating to the production of methamphetamines in May 2011. On Oct. 1, he pleaded guilty to one count of manufacturing methamphetamine from an Aug. 2 charge.

At Wednesday's sentencing, Fuqua received a 20-year prison term for manufacturing methamphetamine with a child present, 40 years for manufacturing methamphetamine, 10 years for possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute and five years for possessing of items used to make methamphetamine.

DAMASCUS, Va. - Authorities have not ruled out additional arrests and charges after Sunday's explosion of an alleged meth lab, which has already led to the arrest of two suspects, Damascus Police Chief Bill Nunley said Monday.

The investigation is still continuing, but there is a possibility of additional charges and arrests in the near future," Nunley said regarding Sunday night's fiery explosion at a Creepers Way house - which also revealed an apparent operating "one-pot" meth lab inside the home.

Nunley offered no further specifics on prospective arrests or charges.

Thomas L. Anderson, 35, of Damascus and Shannon O. Miller, 37, of Abingdon, Va., were arrested shortly

after Sunday's explosion - while a 15-year-old girl, also in the home, escaped injury






One pot meth labs in Virginia


- First one pot lab was seized in the Fall of 2009 in Wythe County

- Prior to 2009 most labs in Virginia consisted of Red P labs






Meth Lab Incidents – 2012






Meth Lab Incidents – 2013





Who has the most meth labs in VA?








What can I do?



- Awareness is the key to ensure your safety.
 - Look for items utilized to manufacture meth
- Don't be fooled by stereotypes
- Look for signs of abnormal behavior
 - Excessive amounts of precursors/ingredients
 - Combinations of ingredients stored together
 - Precursors stored in odd locations
 - Improper use of essential ingredients
